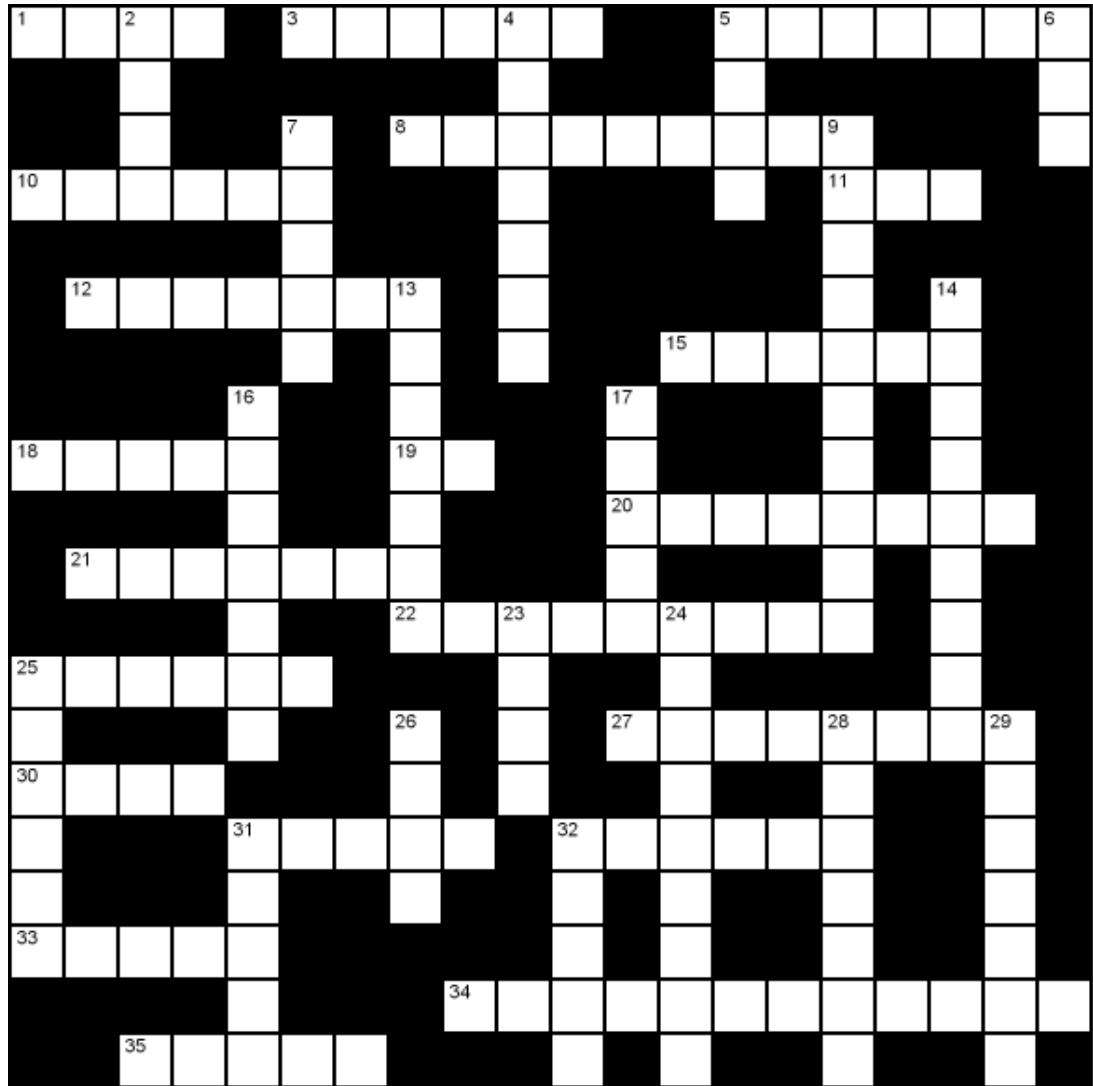


A49 Whoever Exalts Himself Will Be Humbled, Matthew 23:1-12 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time
