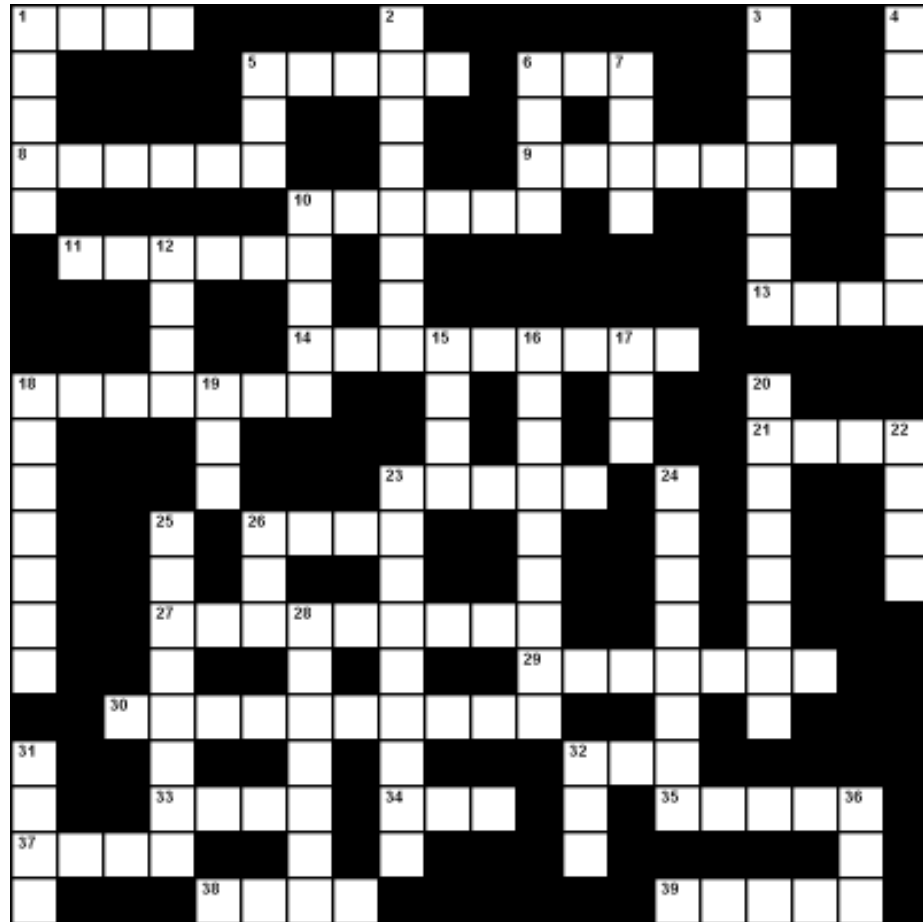


B14a The Sabbath Was Made for Man, Mark 2:23-28 and Mark 3:1-6, Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time
